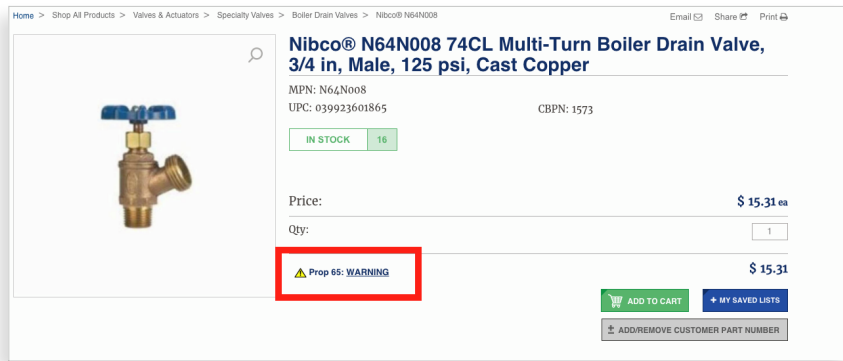

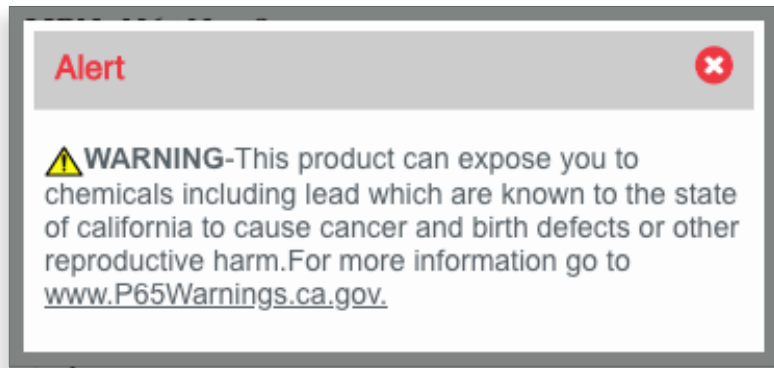
WHAT IS PROP 65?

Proposition 65 requires businesses who sell products to Californians to provide warnings about potential exposures to chemicals that cause cancer, birth defects, or other reproductive harm. By requiring that this information be provided, Prop 65 enables buyers to make informed decisions about their exposures to these chemicals.

The Prop 65 mandate defines how businesses must label products they sell that contain any one of the nearly 900 chemicals identified. Failure to comply with Prop 65 exposes manufacturers, distributors, and retailers to potential liability, including penalties of up to \$2,500 per day, per violation.



Every product requiring a Prop 65 warning is labeled as such throughout your website



All warning labels are displayed clearly to maintain compliance

The State of California requires that:

- All online retailers include a warning for products they knowingly sell to California residents that may expose the customer to chemicals that could cause cancer, birth defects, or other reproductive harm.
- The warning must (a) name of at least one listed chemical that prompted the warning, (b) include the URL www.P65Warnings.ca.gov, which is a source for additional information, and (c) feature a yellow, triangular warning symbol.
